Welcome

Dr. Shyam Pandey - Director IQAC, welcomed the committee members and requested Dr. Ram Sharma, Vice-Chancellor, to set the context for the meeting.

Context Setting

The meeting commenced formally with the Director (IQAC) giving a welcome address. He expressed sincere gratitude to the Vice Chancellor, Pro Vice-Chancellor, distinguished members, and special invitees for their presence and support.

The Vice Chancellor delivered an opening address highlighting the essential need for ongoing improvement in institutional processes. He emphasized the importance of focusing on measurable outcomes to assess the real impact of these processes. While recognizing the value of both input and process, he stressed that the goal should be to achieve tangible, measurable results that demonstrate the institution's commitment to quality and excellence.

A key point in his address was the importance of incorporating student feedback into the evaluation and improvement processes. He highlighted that students, as primary stakeholders, provide valuable insights that can drive meaningful changes. Additionally, he emphasized the necessity of conducting follow-up actions to ensure that feedback and evaluations lead to actionable improvements.

Overall, the Vice Chancellor's address set a clear agenda for the meeting, focusing on measurable outcomes, student feedback, follow-up actions, and adherence to documentation standards as key pillars for enhancing institutional quality and effectiveness.

The Pro Vice-Chancellor emphasized the importance of streamlining the data collection process and fostering a culture of quality within the University. He further stressed the need for active participation from faculty members in data collection efforts, ensuring the effective implementation of templates and Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs). Additionally, he highlighted the importance of regularly gathering data and evidence, proposing the creation of a monthly dashboard to monitor progress, identify strengths, and address areas needing improvement. This approach aims to ensure consistency, transparency, and continuous enhancement in the University's quality assurance processes.

Agenda 1: Review of Previous Meeting Action Points

Dr. Shyam Pandey, the Director of IQAC, informed the committee about the following action points. The review aimed to present the status of teaching, learning, and other institutional processes, as well as the preparation for Assessment and Accreditation by NAAC

Agenda 2: Revised IQAC Formats for Documentation of Various Academic & Allied Activities

The Director, IQAC presented the revised formats related to teaching-learning processes and documentation of academic/departmental activities. These changes aim at enhancing record keeping and standardization of formats. Evidence for teaching-learning activities, including assessment of teaching methods, was discussed to ensure compliance with NAAC guidelines. Minor revisions to the format of the presentation to the Academic Council (AC) were proposed to enhance clarity and improve the presentation of key outcomes. Dr. Shyam also apprised the committee that the revised feedback forms for Alumni Feedback & Teaching Quality Feedback

have been implemented.

Agenda 3: NAAC Cycle 3 preparedness of Academics & Allied Departments

The Director, IQAC, presented key quality parameters requiring immediate attention to strengthen the institution's preparation for NAAC Cycle 3. He also presented an analysis of AQAR data, emphasizing the need for proactive involvement from all stakeholders to address identified challenges.

Dr. Shyam Pandey, Director, IQAC, presented data related to new courses introduced in the last five years and emphasized that this information is critical for the NAAC accreditation process, showcasing the institution's ability to innovate and expand its offerings.

The Director, IQAC, apprised the committee that as per NEP 2020 guidelines and NAAC requirements, all Deans and IQAC SPOCs have been requested to review the curriculum and credit framework guidelines suggested by UGC. The IQAC SPOCs of each school will collaborate with the Academic Planning Department to identify suitable MOOC courses (SWAYAM/NPTEL) for each program, ensuring their integration into the program curriculum.

The Director, IQAC, apprised the committee of the necessity of gathering comprehensive data on the number of awards received, conferences attended, and research projects undertaken by each faculty member. It was informed that IQAC would share standardized data collection templates to ensure systematic and uniform reporting.

The Director emphasized the significance of developing high-quality e-content as per UGC guidelines. Faculty members were encouraged to actively contribute to e-content creation for their respective courses, and Annexure I was referenced for detailed guidance.

The committee was apprised of the need to track students pursuing higher studies post-graduation. Following discussions with stakeholders, it was decided to adopt various strategies for data collection, including forming dedicated WhatsApp groups for alumni by IQAC representatives for each batch. Additionally, IQAC will conduct alumni feedback surveys to gather relevant information about higher studies.

The Director highlighted that Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) should have a minimum duration of 5 days to ensure substantial learning outcomes and effective skill enhancement for participants. He also reiterated the importance of promoting continuous professional development among faculty and students. Academic leaders were advised to motivate faculty and staff to participate actively in FDPs/MDPs organized both within and outside the institution to foster a culture of learning and growth.

Agenda 5: Updates on Accreditation and Ranking

The Committee took note of the following updates:

National Institute Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2024: The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2024 has placed UPES at an overall rank of 59th in the country, with 46th rank in the university category. The university has also made an entry into the Top 50 institutions in India under the 'Innovation' category for the first time.

- Ranked 42nd in Engineering
- Ranked 41st in Management
- Ranked 28th in Law

Times Higher Education (THE) World Ranking 2025: UPES has made a significant leap in the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings 2025. UPES is in the 501-600 band in the World and ranked 8th in India.

QS Asia Rankings 2025: The university has been ranked 148th position in Asia Rankings; Placed 21st among South Asian universities, respectively and 12th in India overall. 2nd among private universities, affirming its commitment to educational quality and its growing influence in higher education.

Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) World University Rankings 2025: The university has been ranked in the overall rank band of 801-850 in the world, ranked first by 'academic reputation' among private universities in India, besides being listed in the Top 3% universities in the world.

National Board of Accreditation (NBA): In the meeting Director, IQAC appreciate the hard work and commitment of Cluster Heads, Faculty Members, Members of Registrar Office, Members of IQAC and other supporting staff members for successfully achieving the desired goal. Seven programs are accredited for School of Advanced Engineering programs, out of which five programs have been reaccredited. Following are the details of the programme:

- B.Tech in Civil Engineering
- B.Tech in Fire and Safety
- B.Tech in Mechanical Engineering
- B.Tech in Mechatronics
- B.Tech in Applied Petroleum Engineering

Agenda 6: Updates on Academic & Allied Activities

School of Business: Dr. Niraj Shirish Mankad, Associate Dean, and Dr. Sumeet Gupta, Professor & Cluster Head, School of Business, presented the following:

- Dr. Niraj Shirish Mankad and Dr. Sumeet Gupta briefed on 203 expert talks organized from 2020 to 2024, including guest lectures, webinars, workshops, and industry sessions.
- They highlighted continuous support for students through the monitoring of industrial tours, summer internship programs (SIP), and dissertation projects.
- Industry involvement in mentoring and project evaluations was emphasized, alongside feedback mechanisms involving students, alumni, and industry experts.
- IAS coaching for BA Public Policy students and analysis of feedback shared before Cluster Consultative Committee Meetings were also discussed.
- Dr. Niraj Shirish Mankad and Dr. Sumeet Gupta outlined various initiatives aimed at enhancing teaching and research, including research seminars, FDPs, and casewriting workshops.
- The role of The Feynman Centre for Teaching Excellence in promoting academic and research excellence was highlighted, along with efforts to foster research culture through publications, funding support, and intellectual property rights (IPR).

School of Advanced Engineering (SoAE): Dr. Nilanjana Banerjee, Associate Professor and Cluster Head, School of Advanced Engineering, presented the following:

- Dr. Nilanjana Banerjee mentioned various events and initiatives, including:
 - Workshops: "Harnessing Embedded Systems and IoT for Next-Gen Applications" (Oct 2024) and GATE & JAM Awareness Session by Prof. Gaurav Sharma (Sept 2024).
 - Expert Talks: Sustainability Lecture by Prof. Jonathan Wong (Sept 2024) and Master Class on Chandrayaan-3 Soft Landing by Prof. Radhakant Padhi.
 - Conferences: Energy Summit 2024 (Sept 2024) and 6th International Conference on ICICCD-2024.
- Dr. Nilanjana Banerjee discussed ongoing training through the Bajaj Engineering Skills Training (BEST) Center, enhancing technical and practical skills.
- It was suggested to increase involvement of external experts in the master classes and other mentoring activities.

School of Law (SoL): Dr. Vinita Singh, Professor, School of Law, presented the following:

- Dr. Vinita Singh highlighted the organization of expert talks, certificate courses, workshops, and master classes on topics like Mergers and Acquisitions, Patents and IPR, and Cloud Computing.
- She discussed engagement in legal awareness programs, QRQT sessions, and Nukkad Nataks.
- Vidhiotsav celebrations, SCHLR Panel Discussions, and visits to the Happy Animal Sanctuary were also mentioned.
- Regular feedback analysis was conducted to enhance the curriculum.
- Dr. Vinita Singh spoke about the standardization of academic content, ADR team support for ₹75K for students, faculty support for conferences, and reduced workload for research faculty.
- Internship opportunities were facilitated through DLSA and a law intern at UCC with the Government of Uttarakhand.

School of Computer Science (SoCS): Dr. Vijaysekhar Chellaboina, Dean, School of Computer Science, presented the following:

- Dr. Vijaysekhar Chellaboina highlighted regular Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) in collaboration with IBM and expert sessions by renowned speakers.
- He discussed the expansion of industry partnerships with AWS, IBM, and Xebia, which enhanced student learning through events like IBM ICE Days and DevOps Days.
- Dr. Vijaysekhar Chellaboina focused on technical and coding sessions tailored for fast learners and those needing support.
- > AMCAT tests were conducted for skill assessments.
- Starting in January 2025, access to the Guvi Platform will provide self-paced courses and coding challenges.
- Curriculum benchmarking and updates are conducted annually to align with global standards.

School of Design (SoD): Dr. Bhaskar Bhatt, Dean, School of Design, presented the following:

- Dr. Bhaskar Bhatt highlighted regular workshops and expert talks aimed at connecting students and faculty with industry leaders, fostering innovation and practical design skills.
- Industry-integrated learning was emphasized, including projects like the Surface Design module with Havells, which aligns academic learning with industry demands.
- Increased internship and placement opportunities were also highlighted as key for building professional portfolios.
- Dr. Bhaskar Bhatt discussed the implementation of a comprehensive feedback system for continuous improvements.
- He explained how curriculum and teaching methods have been enhanced based on feedback analysis.
- The focus on real-world challenges through the Industry in the Classroom initiative and increased emphasis on IPR, patents, and design registrations were also mentioned.

School of Liberal Studies and Media (SLSM): Dr. Jayadev Parida, Assistant Professor, School of Liberal Studies and Media, presented the following:

- Dr. Jayadev Parida highlighted the organized lectures by renowned experts such as Prof. Miles Hewstone (University of Oxford), Dr. Subrato Banerjee (IIT Bombay), and Dr. Meera Mary Sunny (IIT Gandhinagar).
- The school highlighted the achievements of students and faculty.
- Dr. Jayadev Parida hosted academic events, including an academic visit to the National Brain Research Centre (NBRC) and mental health awareness campaigns in collaboration with IQAC.
- The school organized the Web Series Mega Conclave and Voice Conclave, focusing on modern media trends.

School of Health Sciences and Technology (SoHST): Dr. Prashant Sukhla, Professor, School of Health Sciences and Technology, presented the following:

- Dr. Prashant Shukla highlighted the introduction of new facilities like the Fish Lab, Worm Lab, and Fly Lab to enhance student learning and outcomes.
- Dr. Prashant Shukla highlighted the organized wellness events, including Eat Right Campus, Utthan, Eat Right Mela, and hands-on training on Microbiome Analysis.

Career Services and Alumni Relations: Mr. Jitendra Gadhvi, Director-Career Services, appraised the committee about various interventions like leadership series, employability boot camp, social internships, and EDGE-Training & Assessment Programs. Mr. Prateek Kala, Assistant Director-Alumni Relations, briefed about various activities and initiatives conducted by Alumni relations for UPES alumni like Chapter Meets, Homecomings and Events.

Dr Ram Sharma, Vice Chancellor, has given deeper insight on more meaningful culmination of activities organized by the Career Service Cell and Alumni Relations Office, he has emphasized on the outcome of the process rather than the input and process followed to achieve the desired results. All Activities should have clearly defined outcomes to be achieved at the end of the process, also it is equally important to document all the events as per the SOPs. He has

suggested to involve Alumni as well for the welfare measures and financial support for the needy students. It is presumed that the well-established alumni would be happy to offer scholarships or funding for the wards of Uttarakhand martyrs, socio-economic disadvantaged groups, and needy students. Online mechanism could be deployed to raise funds.

Research and Development Department (R&D): Dr. Syed Mohammad Tauseef, Associate Dean-R&D, appraised the committee that total 165 research projects have been submitted in 2024 out of which 21 have been sanctioned with net worth 789 lakhs (including BIRAC-SPARSH project). He also appraised about the status of publications and IPR. Dr Tauseef brief the committee about R&D initiatives in form of a dedicated platform for projects call and review and SEED projects are now encouraged to find industry partner with matching grant.

Dr. Pankaj Kumar, Associate Dean-R&D, appraised the committee that the proposed intake of PhD candidates for academic year 2025-26 is 100 full time and 26 part time. He also mentioned that 431 PhD candidates have been admitted in 2024.

Controller of Examination: Dr. Mohammed Yaqoot, COE, briefed about the various examination activities' conducted from March to November 2024. He also appraised the committee that 14343 students appeared for end semester examination in May 2024, 1193 students (graduating Batch) appeared in supplementary examinations in March 2024. Dr. Mohammed Yaqoot appraised the committee about the new automation initiative in examination process regarding collection of degree, transcript, duplicate grade card through QP code.

Runway: Mr. Mohit Nagpal, Sr. Manager-Runway, apprised the committee that Runway Incubator has received additional grants and support from various agencies to promote innovation and entrepreneurship, including a grant support of Rs. 2 Crore from the Government of Uttarakhand through the State Business Incubator, grant support for startups under the HDFC Bank CSR initiative, and funding under the Genesis scheme by MEITY, alongside mentorship and resources to accelerate startup growth. He also appraised that Runway has empowered over 170 startup ideas across Cohorts 3 and 4 and awarded grants to 25 startups from Cohorts 3 to develop their prototypes/products, providing mentorship, funding, and resources to accelerate their growth.

Agenda 7: Initiatives/Proposal for the Accreditation, Ranking and improving Quality Culture

Dr. Shyam Pandey, Director, IQAC, briefed the committee on several initiatives undertaken by IQAC to enhance the quality culture at the University. Key initiatives included organizing an expert talk on "Proposed Binary Accreditation of NAAC" by Dr. Shakuntala Katre and participating in prominent events such as the AACSB Seminar and the QSHES APAC 2024 Conference. Proposed programs include a Professional Advancement Program on "Intellectual Property Rights (IPR): A Macroscopic Understanding of Patenting and Beyond!" in collaboration with the Goa – Center for Excellence in Intellectual Property (G-CEIP) and Goa College of Pharmacy, Panaji. Additionally, one-week Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) on Outcome-Based Education and Accreditation are planned at NITTTR Chandigarh in March 2025 and on Outcome-Based Education and NEP 2020 at NITTTR Bhopal in July 2025. Furthermore, collaborations are in progress with HRDC for Faculty Induction Programs and the Indo Universal Collaboration for Engineering Education (IUCEE) to focus on Outcome-Based Education (OBE) and ABET Accreditation.
